To enhance our security online, Hyundai Finance disabled Transport Layer Security (TLS) versions 1.0 and 1.1 on our websites. You may need to complete one of the following steps to ensure your system is compatible with TLS 1.2: update your web browser, operating system or enable TLS 1.2.

How to enable TLS 1.2

Internet Explorer

- Open Internet Explorer
- Click: Tools Menu (gear menu in top right) > Internet options > Advanced (tab) > scroll down to the bottom > check the box next to 'Use TLS 1.2'

Google Chrome

- Open Google Chrome
- Click: the 'customize and control Google Chrome' icon in the top right > settings > scroll down and click on 'Advanced' > Open Proxy Settings > Advanced (tab) > scroll down to the bottom > check the box next to 'Use TLS 1.2'

Mozilla Firefox

- Open Firefox
- In the address bar, type about:config and press Enter
- In the Search field, enter tls. Find and double-click the entry for security.tls.version.min
- Set the integer value to 3 to force protocol of TLS 1.3
- Click OK
- Close your browser and restart Mozilla Firefox

Safari

- If you are using Safari version 7 or greater, TLS 1.2 is automatically enabled.
